Today's automatic transmissions are highly complex devices, and a complete rebuild can be an expensive proposition. But, according to all the data available, regular checks and maintenance can extend the life of an automatic transmission.

So, every car owner could benefit from Cottman's National Check Your Transmission Day, if they're willing to take part.

STRATEGIES AND DESIRED RESPONSE:

By creating a day dedicated to having your transmission checked, Cottman is trying to take the idea of getting your transmission checked out of the realm of a service and into the world of a celebration. TRANSMISSION DAY

The hope is that by giving the event a celebratory atmosphere, we can bring more consumers in to get their transmissions checked. And, since the National Check Your Transmission Day is being initiated by Cottman, only Cottman centers are celebrating this event...and only Cottman centers are offering the TransCheck 21 PLUS Inspection.

Very often, transmission problems start out small: too small for the average driver to notice. The first signs of a slip or chatter may be barely noticeable to anyone but the most skilled technician.

The technicians at today's Cottman centers are highly trained and experienced with automatic transmissions: It's even part of the company name. They're more likely to recognize small problems that the average consumer wouldn't think twice about.

And, thanks to Cottman's TransCheck 21 PLUS Inspection, they have a valuable tool to help them pinpoint the source of that tiny problem...long before it puts the transmission at risk. A simple repair may be all it takes to avoid a massive rebuild later on, and the cost will be spectacularly lower.

CONSTRAINTS:

Time. The National Check Your Transmission Day is a one-day event, so any hope of building a relationship with a new customer will have to be done quickly. This is often counterproductive, because customers usually need time to connect with the shop.

One way to extend the time limitation is to expand the celebration to the entire month of October which is Car Care Month. Another option for those centers closed on Saturdays is celebrate the week of or the following week. In addition, franchisees can remind customers throughout the year of the importance of this day. While customers do not need to wait for October 21st to have their transmission checked, the real importance of this day is awareness. We want to remind all customers their transmission is very important to their vehicles performance. Also to help as many customers as possible during that day would be to limit October 21 to the Cottman TransCheck 21 PLUS Inspection, and schedule a return visit for any services or repairs. This gives the center time to meet with more potential customers, and provide them with enough one-on-one time to help build a personal relationship. Competitive Landscape: Every transmission shop — and most general repair shops — would be happy to perform a transmission check, so the competition is intense.
